Seniors Safe at Home

A Handy Guide to Avoiding
Scams, Schemes, and Cons

PROTECT YOURSELF

This guide is not intended to scare you. Rather, it offers valuable tips to help you **avoid the common pitfalls** that cost seniors their hard-earned savings.

Common Red Flags

- **"Win a Vacation" Forms:** Do not fill out contest forms in malls or stores. This often leads to junk mail lists and persistent calls from telemarketers.
- **Unsolicited Checks:** If a stranger sends you a check for no reason, do not deposit it. If they ask you to deposit it and wire money back, it is a scam.



The Golden Rule

If it seems too good to be true, it IS too good to be true!

Electronic Safety

- **Don't Click:** Delete suspicious emails immediately.
- **Hang Up:** If a caller pressures you, hang up the phone.

HOME IMPROVEMENT SAFETY

Before the Work Begins

- **Verify Licenses:** Before contracting work, review the license status of plumbers, electricians, and home improvement contractors.

- **Beware of Drop-ins:** Be skeptical of unsolicited "Home Repairmen" showing up at your door.
- Avoid all **"Door-to-Door" sales** solicitations.

Before You Sign Anything

- Talk to trusted family members, friends, or an attorney before entering into financial deals.
- **Stop and think.** Scammers want you to act fast. Take your time. Never make major money decisions under pressure.

BANK SAFE & ID THEFT

Secure Your Data

- **Store It:** Keep checks, credit card statements, medical bills, and passwords in a safe place.
- **Shred It:** Invest in a paper shredder to discard outdated financial documents. Thieves often go through trash to find personal info.

Verify Callers

- If someone calls **claiming to be from your bank**, do not discuss your business.
- Ask for their name, hang up, and call the phone number listed on the back of your credit card or bank statement to verify the call.

Monitor Your Credit

- Federal law allows you to obtain **one free credit report** from each of the three major agencies per year.
